# CHEMICAL FERTILIZERS CONTROL (LICENCE) REGULATIONS 1980

#### Chemical Fertilizers Control Act - Section 10 - March 1980

- 1. These regulations may be cited as the Chemical Fertilizers Control (Licence) Regulations 1980.
  - 2. In these regulations-
  - "Act" means the Chemical Fertilizers Control Act:
  - "applicant" means a person who applies to the Chief Agricultural Officer for a licence;
  - "licence" means a licence issued under section 3 of the Act.
  - 3. Every application for a licence shall be-
    - (i) the name and address of the applicant;
    - (ii) the type of licence applied for, that is to say wholesaler or retailer;
    - (iii) the fertilizers in respect of which the application is made;
    - (iv) the address of the premises in respect of which the application is made.
- (2) signed, in the case of an individual, by the applicant or in the case of any other person, by such person as is authorised to sign on behalf of the applicant.
- (3) supplemented by such written information as satisfies the Chief Agricultural Officer that-
  - (a) chemical fertilizers may safely be sold on the premises in respect of which the application is made;
  - (b) arrangements have been made to store fertilizers separate from foodstuffs;
  - (c) in the case of an applicant for a retailer licence, separate scales have been provided exclusively for the weighing of fertilizers.
  - 4. (1) A licence granted by the Chief Agricultural Officer shall -
    - (a) be in the form set out in First Schedule; and
    - (b) subject to paragraph (3), be issued on payment of the fee specified on the Second Schedule in respect of the licence.
  - (2) Every licence, unless previously revoked or suspended, shall-
    - (a) be valid for a period of twelve months from the date of issue;
    - (b) subject to paragraph (3), be renewable on payment of the prescribed fee specified in the Second Schedule.
- (3) No fee shall be payable for the grant or renewal of a licence in respect of any cooperative society.
- 5. (1) Where the conditions of a licence are amended during its currency, a new licence including the amended conditions shall be issued to the licensee to replace the original licence.
- (2) The Chief Agricultural Officer may, where he is satisfied that a licence has been destroyed, lost or defaced and on payment of the prescribed fee, issue to the licensee a duplicate licence.

## **CONDITIONS**

This licence is issued subject to the following conditions-

- (1) The licence shall not be capable of being transferred or assigned.
- (2) The licensee shall store the chemical fertilizers separate from food stuffs.
- (3) The licensee, in the case of a retailer, shall use separate scales exclusively for the purpose of weighing fertilizers.
