

LOUD SPEAKERS AND AMPLIFIERS (RESTRICTION OF USE) (CUREPIPE)
REGULATIONS 1955

GN No 5 of 1955

Regulations made by the Town Council of Curepipe under section (3) (1) (d) of the Noise Prevention Ordinance

1. Short title

These Regulations may be cited as The Loud Speakers and Amplifiers (Restriction of Use) Curepipe Regulation 1955.

2. Use of loud speakers and amplifiers prohibited on certain occasions

It shall not be lawful for any person to make use at any time in the Town of Curepipe, of any loud speaker or amplifier mounted in such a way as to be easily moved from place to place;

Provided that the prohibition in this Regulation imposed shall not apply to the use of loud speakers-

- (a) In connection with any Legislative, Municipal or Town Council Election at any time-
 - i. In the case of a Legislative Council Election between the date of issue of the writ of election, or
 - ii. In the case of a Municipal or Town Council Election between the date of issue of the notice that an election will be held

And the day following that on which a candidate is declared elected;

- (b) By the Police for the purpose of making announcement or of controlling or regulating traffic or crowds;

Provided also that the Prohibition in this Regulation imposed shall not apply to the use of loud speakers or amplifiers in any Church, Temple, Mosque, Pagoda or other place of worship where a religious ceremony is being performed or at any place where a ceremonial parade or a public function of an official character is being held where such use is restricted to the purpose and is a formal part of the religious ceremony, ceremonial parade or public function aforesaid.

3. Preventive action

Any Police Officer not below the rank of Sub-Inspector or any officer deputed by the Town Council may take such action as he may deem reasonable to prevent any breach of these Regulations or any continuance of such breach.

4. G.N. No. of 1953 revoked

The loud Speakers and Amplifiers (Prohibition of use) Curepipe Regulations, 1953 are revoked.

Approved by the Governor in Council on the seventh day of January, one thousand nine hundred and fifty-five and ordered to come into force at once.
